Excellent swimming opportunities are provided by a gently sloping sand beach. *Parents and caregivers* are advised that the beach and swimming area are not supervised.



Boat launching and docking facilities are provided for those who enjoy boating and want access to the Kawartha Lakes system.

HIKING

The northern portion of the conservation area has been left undeveloped, except for the establishment of a **hiking and cross-country ski trail**. The trail passes through a variety of habitats ranging from wetland to woodland to open field. It provides an excellent opportunity for visitors to discover a variety of plants and wildlife.

The use of **group camping** facilities available at Selwyn Beach can be arranged by contacting our main office at (705)745-5791 to make a reservation. Family and group camping is also available at the Warsaw Caves Conservation Area and Campground, near Warsaw (www.warsawcaves.com).

The **Selwyn Beach Conservation Area** is located on the northeast shore of Chemong Lake just 20 minutes from Peterborough. The park offers visitors an ideal location for relaxation and outdoor recreation.



The 29 hectare (72 acre) property was acquired by the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority in 1973 to help preserve a section of the Kawartha Lakes shoreline for public use. It was purchased through the efforts of the Otonabee Region Conservation Foundation with a generous contribution from the Nature Conservancy of Canada, and additional assistance from various individuals, organizations and industries in the Peterborough area.

The Selwyn Beach Conservation Area provides a multi-purpose day use facility with access to Chemong Lake, while protecting the beauty and features of the site.
