

Good Dog Bad Dog



You are welcome to bring your dog to the park (after all he's part of the family) for a day visit or to camp. As a responsible owner you must respect the rules that apply to you and your dog during your visit.

Dogs must at all times be on a leash not exceeding 2 metres (6 feet) in length. Warsaw Caves and Selwyn Beach Conservation Areas do not offer any leash-free areas.

Dogs are not permitted in swimming areas, on beaches or in any other area that may be posted as off limits to dogs. Sorry, but for safety reasons and out of regard for other visitors, we do not allow dogs in the caves.

Do not leave your pet unattended. Dogs must be quiet and under control at all times and are not permitted to disturb other park visitors or campers, and they may not harass wildlife.

You are required to clean up after your pet – poop and scoop, please!



Additional information

The following is provided for purposes of general information only.

Be an informed dog owner. Be aware of and understand your obligations under the laws that govern the ownership or control of a dog in Ontario.

The Conservation Authorities Act R.R.O. 1990, Regulation 128, Section 10 governs the presence of dogs and other animals on properties owned or managed by the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority.

Dog owners are responsible for the conduct of their pets under Dog Owners' Liability Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter D.16.

Owners of dogs identified as pit bulls under the Act have additional obligations as set forth under Ontario Regulation 157/05, Pit Bull Controls. Any dog having the appearance of a pit bull is deemed to be such under the Regulation.

Under the Act, the local municipality is empowered to enact bylaws which are more restrictive.

Certain exemptions are in place for service dogs.

The Otonabee Region Conservation Authority is not liable for the conduct of dog owners or their dogs while on Authority property.
